## BY ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

On August 12, 1997, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Environmental Quality Board (EQB). rulemaking amends 25 Pa. Code Chapters 91, 97 and 101. The authority for this regulation is the Clean Streams Law, the Act of June 22, 1937 (P.L. 1987, No. 394) (35 P.S. § 691.5). The proposed regulation was published in the August 23, 1997 Pennsylvania Bulletin with a 30-day public comment period. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on September 21, 1999.

This rulemaking is part of the Department of Environmental Protection's (DEP's) Regulatory Basics Initiative. The amendments are intended to eliminate provisions which impose disproportionate economic costs; are obsolete; or are more stringent than federal regulations unless justified by a compelling public interest. The amendments are also intended to support DEP's pollution prevention measures and more easily apply new green technologies.

We have reviewed this regulation and find it to be generally in the public interest. However, we have a concern with Section 91.15(a) which requires compliance with Chapter 16 (relating to water quality toxics management strategy - statement of policy). By definition, statements of policy contain non-binding guidelines. If the EQB intends to require compliance with Chapter 16, it should promulgate this chapter as a proposed regulation.

## THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. Regulation No.7-323 from the Environmental Quality Board, as submitted to the Commission on September 21, 1999, is approved; and
