Regulation No. 57-225 Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission Street Railway Transportation

On January 24, 2002, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission (PUC). This rulemaking amends 52 Pa. Code Chapter 35. The proposed regulation was published in the February 9, 2002 *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 30-day public comment period. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on October 3, 2002.

This final-form regulation from the PUC deletes existing regulations that deal with street railway transportation. These regulations govern private companies providing street railway service. Currently, there are only two entities, the Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority (SEPTA) and the Port Authority of Allegheny County (PAAC), that provide such services. As both SEPTA and PAAC are public entities, they do not fall under the jurisdiction of the PUC.

We have determined this regulation is consistent with the statutory authority of the Commission (66 Pa. C.S. §501) and the intention of the General Assembly. Having considered all of the other criteria of the Regulatory Review Act, we find promulgation of this regulation is in the public interest.
